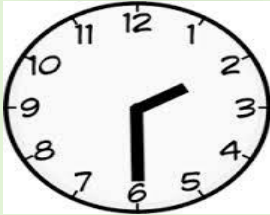

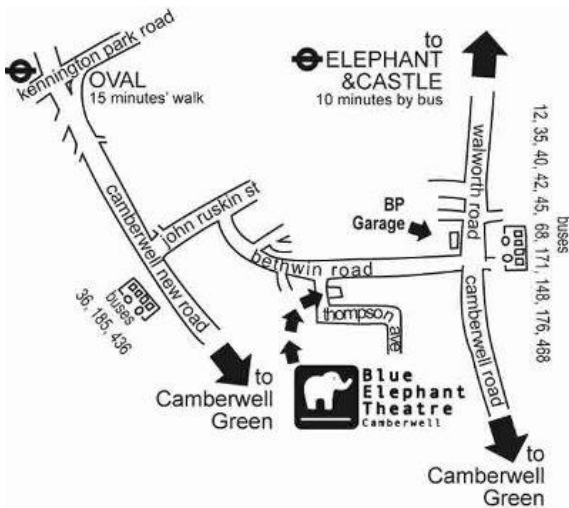
The performance is a story about

## Parking and Access

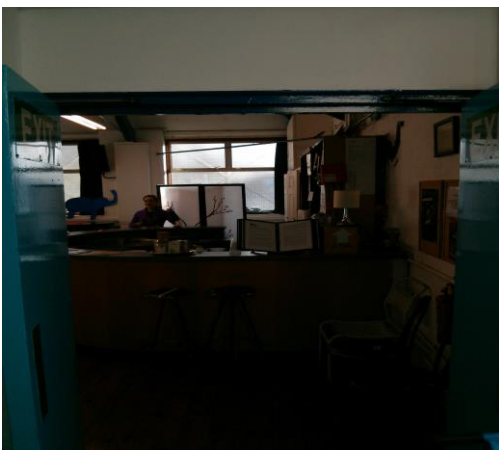


Blue Badge Holders is on Bethwin Road, 35 meters from the main theatre entrance. The route involves crossing the road and there are no adjacent dropped kerbs up to the pavement level.

The closest parking bays to the theatre are on Thompson Avenue next to cycle racks. These are not Blue Badge bays but are on the same pavement side as the theatre.



This is the outside of the theatre when you arrive.



When you arrive, you will go in the main entrance.

When you go in the building you will see this.



This is where you can wait until it's show time!

This is also the entrance to the performance space where the show will happen.



You can meet the actors that are in the play 15 minutes before the show will start!



This is a picture of the actors and the puppet called Jack Frost.



You will also meet another puppet that is in the show.

Say hello to Laila

There will also be shadow puppetry within the show.

This is inside the theatre where the show will happen (with no people)

When you go in there may be lots of people there too. You will have your own seat to sit on.

The usher will be handing out hand made snow flakes

The actor's will also have these in the show.

In the show, there will be lots and lots of bubbles.

---



The actors will use these to blow bubbles, they might come into the audience for you to catch the bubbles.



The lights will not go off in the theatre but it may get a little darker.

(This picture is an example of what it may be like)

There will also be some bright lights. If it is too bright you can wear tinted glasses or cover your eyes.

You can also move around to a different seat where the lights may be less bright.



When the show starts, you will hear music and voices. If it is too loud you can cover your ears with your hands or use ear defenders.



Some people may shout out or clap their hands throughout the show. This is ok. They are showing that they enjoy the play. If you want to you can clap your hands too or choose to be quiet.



If you want to leave the theatre at any point, there is a quiet space where you can go to relax and play.

There may be other people in those rooms.



There will be some sensory lights and toys in the space (as in the photo).

When you are ready you can come back in.

Some of the actors may ask you to join in at times. You can join in if you feel comfortable or just listen to other people joining in. This is called interacting with the characters.



When the performance has finished, the actors will come out on stage, stand up together. This is called a curtain call. Everyone will clap a lot so the actors know how much they enjoyed the show. Some people will also cheer and make a noise to show that they had a good time.

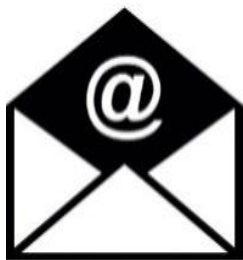


This is where you will exit when the show has finished.
